Social Justice *FAMILY* Event - Meal Packaging on Hold

The following was written by Martin Luther King in 1963. It still applies today.

“First, I must confess that over the past few years I have been gravely disappointed with the white moderate. I have almost reached the regrettable conclusion that the Negro's great stumbling block in his stride toward freedom is not the White Citizen's Council or the Ku Klux Klanner, but the white moderate, who is more devoted to "order" than to justice; who prefers a negative peace which is the absence of tension to a positive peace which is the presence of justice; who constantly says: "I agree with you in the goal you seek, but I cannot agree with your methods of direct action"; who paternalistically believes he can set the timetable for another man's freedom; who lives by a mythical concept of time and who constantly advises the Negro to wait for a "more convenient season." Shallow understanding from people of good will is more frustrating than absolute misunderstanding from people of ill will. Lukewarm acceptance is much more bewildering than outright rejection.”

Immigration Policy:

The Supreme Court has upheld the Trump Administration's policy of keeping people in Mexico before they can seek asylum in the US. Those people typically will wait a year, on the streets of border cities in Mexico, with no way to support themselves, subject to gang violence and other hardships.

Mass Priority Emergency Legislation 2020

HD.4945: An Act providing for emergency cash assistance in response to COVID-19, which would send a check of \$1,000 to qualifying Massachusetts households to mitigate the economic impacts of the pandemic and the looming economic downturn

HD.4958: An Act relative to COVID-19 emergency unemployment expansion, for people not employed by large firms and thus not eligible for traditional unemployment.

HD.4963: The COVID-19 pandemic poses a grave and immediate threat to public health and to incarcerated people, who are housed in close quarters with no ability to engage in social distancing. This act balances decarceration with public safety issues.
