To our bridgers:

It would do you a disservice to pretend that your experience of finishing high school is normal. It's not. As Unitarian Universalists, we celebrate the transition from high school to life beyond with a bridging ceremony. I hope you feel proud of all that you've accomplished, more familiar with your own strength and resilience, steady in the truth that you have always been enough, exactly as you are.

Amidst all the anxiety and grief, the ambiguity and strangeness of life right now, I hope you feel the love of this community today.

It is an incredibly strange and stressful time to be graduating from high school and looking towards the next stage of your life. Maybe you're thrilled. Maybe you're scared, or confused, or disappointed. Maybe you're all that and more. Amidst all the complexity, we at UUCSW give you our blessing, we celebrate all that you have become, and we hope to see you again.
